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PHONOLOGICAL AWARENESS IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION: THE IMPORTANCE OF STIMULATION FOR THE FUTURE PROCESS LITERACY

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ABSTRACT

Literacy is a crucial element for children's academic and cognitive development, and phonological awareness is fundamental in this process.
